CEO Report - Paul Gemmill

I want to start by saying thankyou to those that have supported the Club throughout the winter months, as we welcome back our Members who travelled away and hope you had a wonderful holiday.

We have had a couple of very wet and cooler months in a row that did lead to some issues with our green's playability and appearance. Our course staff have been constantly monitoring them over the past months and maintenance practices have had to be amended to assist the greens through this period.

As I write this they are already coming back, and we are now rolling regularly again but the rain has been relentless, so we thank you for your understanding.

However, anecdotally all our golf package visitors have unanimously praised our courses condition considering this current climate of wet and cold weather with many of our visitor's home courses closed for many weeks due to the incredibly wet conditions.

The closest regularly updated rain gauges in Cobram paint the picture of how wet is has been with 160mm of rain in August and September compared to the 88mm average for those months. In the same period last year, we had 83mm. The potholes both on the cart paths and roadways became an issue to keep on top of especially with much of the labor force banging away at our bunker drainage program which has been a great success and timely considering the rain we have had.

Our Club recently signed an agreement with our great partner at Berrigan Shire to help us with the upkeep of our driveways and car parks so we will soon have a system in place to keep our roadways in a more consistently safer condition.

The clubhouse was rocking over the colder months, and not just with our wonderful Members, some of whom have returned from winter expeditions to the north. Holidaying golf groups, sponsored football/netball clubs and local social members were all here in great numbers.

The Super's Summary Ben Lucas

As we look back over the winter it is pleasing to see how much work has been accomplished on the golf course. All but one bunker on the Captains front has had subsurface drainage installed along with a herringbone system on the approach to the 6 Captains Green. This equates to over 1km of drainage in the ground and with the wet start to spring the benefits are noticeable when compared to the other 27 holes that haven't been started.

Works on the reshaping of the Presidents 10th tee are well under way, with turf laid on Tuesday 4th of October. A decision on whether the Tee will be opened for Club Championships will depend on how well the turf responds to being cut, transported, and laid. There will be a concrete track installed on this tee as well along with a new creek crossing all on the right-hand side so that cart traffic will

no longer be required near the road. The timeline on the completion of the track is dependent on when we can design a suitable bridge crossing. In the meantime, a temporary gravel track will be laid so that golf carts are not required to drive on the newly laid turf. Access across the creek will be via driving around the ladies tee and using the existing crossing as per the diagram below.

Tocumwal Golf Club, Conceptual Plan for 10th tee Presidents Course September 2022



The new 'Graham Thomas' bare rooted roses that have been planted along side 18 Captains are looking healthy after planting. The addition of new steel edging and mulch compost finalises work for the moment in this garden.

With these jobs nearing completion our focus on the course will be to attend to course maintenance and presentation.

Over the course of winter some areas of the greens thinned out which can be attributed to several factors. These range from the reduction of soil temperatures, reduced growth, shade affected greens, above average rainfall, herbicide applications for moss and pearlwort issues together with increased traffic via higher rounds of golf. To remedy this over the past 12 weeks numerous practices have been undertaken to assist the greens to recovery. Including but not limited to; raising the height of cut, eliminating growth regulators, reducing the amount of rolling, solid tyne aeration and applications of penetrating wetting agents to allow the movement of water through the soil profile. Along with the addition of foliar amino acids and potassium-based fertiliser the turf is on its way to recovery. Light frequent applications of sand dusting will encourage the sward of grass to fill in although this can only be achieved when weather conditions are favourable.

With over 40mm of rain forecast for this week I remind all members and guests to please be considerate of wet areas throughout the golf course. With the soil already at field capacity any additional rainfall greatly slows the infiltration rate of moisture through the soil profile. Some fairways have been roped off completely for course protection and an assessment will be made as conditions change. When possible, I would ask that we try to keep a maximum of 2 carts per group, as it will greatly reduce the traffic areas around the course through the coming weeks as we hopefully begin to dry out.

With the rainfall that we are receiving potholes are inevitable, with this in mind all tracks have been smudged and rolled last week so please try and keep carts to designated tracks around the course and always keep golf carts off the mown surrounds around the greens.

Thankyou and good luck to all participating in the upcoming Club Championships.

2022 Presentation Night & Gala Dinner


Tickets are now available to purchase for our 2022 Golf Presentation Night & Gala Dinner.
