It certainly has been a big year for our Club with some incredible upgrades to our facilities and renovations coming soon. But these once-in-a-generation improvements come off the back of a very successful period for our Club.

The momentum, we as a Club, have achieved and the progress we have made means the state government has confidently committed financial assistance for us to not only grow but ensure our Club's future for our members and community.

We have achieved some impressive numbers for the calendar year including 50,344 rounds of golf and 11,568 carts hired (average 32 carts per day), this means our 69 carts on average are hired 167 times each per year.

In our catering department we have sold 25,000 coffees, 101,754 schooners of beer, 35,000 glasses of wine, 8,033 golf package breakfasts and sold 75,018 meals.

All of the above have been diligently serviced by our incredible staff, sometimes under pressure but always with a smile.

I thank our Club President Jennie Hehir and the Board of Directors for their tireless efforts and decision making that I am sure will hold our Club in good stead for our future and as well thank our management team and attentive staff.

Lastly, thank you to our volunteers, committees, pennant teams and all of our members that support our Club so graciously.


In the lead-up to Christmas, one of our more popular days was held, Christmas Cheer Day.

The Super's Summary - Ben Lucas

Course renovations have come and gone and while the weather on the day was less than ideal, the result has been a success.


Greens were scarified which was followed by topdressing and greens aeration with a 12mm solid tyne. The rain hindered the rubbing process throughout the morning but the wind in the afternoon dried things out nicely which allowed the sand to be incorporated into the aeration holes. Greens are monitored daily, and mowing practices will resume 7 days after the practices have been completed. An additional application of dusting sand will be applied during this process for smoothness along with rolling practices for firmness.

Did you know? There was approximately 90 cubic metres of topdressing sand used on the 36 holes and practice greens during the renovation practice.

Moving on to the fairways, the Presidents course fairways were scarified this year after records indicated the Captains were done last year (my information in the previous newsletter was incorrect). If anyone has been on the course, a massive amount of organic material has been removed from these fairways. Our contractors even said that they had to slow down by two gears due to how thick they were and how much material was being removed. This is due to them being missed during the Covid pandemic.

I would also like to thank all the volunteers that came for the working bee throughout that day. Although due to the wind I think as many branches were falling as what was getting picked up. I will endeavour to work with our Club Captain John Crilly in the new year to organise another working bee, stay tuned.

Finally, on behalf of all the green staff, I wish all members and guests a merry Christmas and a happy new year. For those who are travelling, stay safe and we will see you all on the course in 2023.


Christmas Trading
