The Super's Summary - Ben Lucas

Course staff have been busy with numerous cultural practices taking place on the greens over the past month. As mentioned in the previous newsletter, we have successfully been able to complete an aggressive double groom and dust at the beginning of April followed by a lighter more maintenance level groom and dust 2 weeks later. Applications of a secondary plant growth regulator has reduced mowing requirements which has enabled more frequent rolling to take place. The investment of a new moisture monitoring device has also provided critical data which has seen a great reduction in watering requirements on the greens.

All these in combination has seen an increase in green firmness, speed, and consistency across all putting surfaces.

The corellas have caused significant headaches over the past 6 weeks. Watching them closely, we have been able to track them and more accurately predict their movements. Thanks to all members who have assisted in notifying myself when they spot the pest birds. You may have heard the newly purchased gas gun being fired of to move the birds on. Targeted specific applications with the gas gun has been found to be a safer option to move the birds offsite. Most times only 4 or 5 blasts are required for control for the day.

An exciting period in the turf industry has been the development of a selective herbicide which has claims to remove couch out of bent grass greens. We obviously have an issue with encroachment so there will be some trials taking place on the 9th Captains and 17th Captains greens this autumn. Please note that 7 - 14 days after application some minor transient bleaching of bent grass will occur. I will keep providing information on the results via the members newsletter.

The technology associated with our GPS Sprayer will be fully utilised over the next 6 – 8 weeks with some exciting times ahead. All fairways will be blanket sprayed with a selective herbicide for the kikuyu. There will be some minor discoloration post application for about 20 days. 1 week after application we have a drone coming to map the course that will identify all of the kikuyu affected which will have turned yellow by that stage. These drones are used heavily in the agriculture industry for weed identification, greatly reducing active ingredient and cost inputs. Once the course is mapped, a selected piece of kikuyu is identified in the footage and the associated artificial intelligence will pick up the same pigmented kikuyu across the entire course. This map is then sent to the sprayer and the need for blanket applications will no longer be required with the gps sprayer only applying chemical on the selected areas.


SATURDAY PENNANT RESULTS
