CEO Report - Paul Gemmill

Dear Members,

Our annual report was released at the end of September with some interesting talking points. Firstly, a net profit of \$184,253 is pleasing but also somewhat frustrating at what could have been.

Last years profit of \$594,592 was inflated by \$381,315 of NSW job saver subsidies which effectively puts us on par with the year before however the disappointment comes from a huge loss of anticipated income caused by devastating flood events.

The late October, November, December & January 2022 trading months were on par with the previous year but our pre booked Golf packages, camping crowd and traditional holiday traveller's clientele was decimated through the impact of flooding and the perceived loss of access to our club as reported via all media outlets.

But our club was one of the lucky ones with a few of our Golf on the Murray partner clubs suffering devastating course infrastructure damage and many of their staff and community members having homes inundated by flood water or cut off from assistance or basic amenities during this time.

Our new alfresco gaming & members entrance is nearing completion, this is not part of our future major plans but a scheduled upgrade from the tired old room and fire escape stairs we had that were constructed in 2005.

As part of the new alfresco the club has also recently invested in 9 new entitlements, this occurrence is very significant considering we sold 9 entitlements in 2018 when the club faced some more uncertain times.

Moving forward there is much to be excited about at Club Tocumwal with our Major redevelopment set to begin this year once costed, our course masterplan nearing completion and record numbers of golfers pre booked on our courses but with plenty of space for members and new visitors.

Once again, I would like to publicly thank our tremendous volunteers both on the golf course and bowling greens, our board of directors and our sports committees for their tireless and sometimes underacknowledged commitment and drive to help our club grow and move forward.

On The Course with Ben Lucas

A massive 80mm of rain was recorded here at the golf course during the previous rainfall event, looking at the radar throughout Tuesday it appeared that most of it

was separating around Tocumwal but once it hit 3pm it didn't stop until 11am on Wednesday. Remarkably the course has held up well, with the bunker drainage doing its job on the captains course the focus was to pump the remaining bunkers on the Presidents in preparation for the weekends Club Championships.



Looking back over the winter months we were successful in continuing with the bunker drainage works along with the installation of geohex panelling in the track around the Presidents putting green. Many thanks to the Volunteers that assisted with the project. Along with this, the practice nets received a makeover and a new shed constructed at the teaching sheds to move the ball washing machine outside. This will enable our professionals to have a much-needed space for training and club fitting. We also had the Air 2 G2 machine pump huge amounts of oxygen into the soil profile of the greens without any surface disturbance, this also assisted the greens to drain the rain that we received.



All bunkers have now been edged in preparation for the Spring Tournament, Club Championships and Growing Season.

The focus moving forward through October is the preparation of the courses for our Club Championships and I wish all Members the best of luck throughout the event. Once these have concluded we will move our attention towards the renovation of tees complexes which will involve scarification of all 4.65 ha of tee tops and surrounds, following a cleanup and a mow the plan is to aerate them with a hollow tine.

Marty Walsh's mail from the Pro Shop

Due to the introduction of the new MiClub tee sheets, booking system and competitions as well as our members embracing the MiScore scoring app for competitions here at Toc, we have had an incredibly busy start to September.

Thank you to the golf operations staff for their added workload and extra hours needed in changing over and updating twelve months' worth of golf packages and social golfers that the club heavily rely on.

Unfortunately, in the first week of operations, we encountered a few obstacles and in relation to the women's 27-hole championships. We had a complex issue with back of house and MiClub were great with assisting us, but we still had a slight glitch for this event.

The MiScore scoring app is an internet-based system that requires internet mobile service connection with your phone. If you struggle with Optus or Vodafone mobile coverage in the Tocumwal area, then you are likely to struggle with the scoring app so best to get a scorecard when you register at the pro shop as a precaution. Also please be mindful, that if it is a long weekend and there are more visitors to the township then normal (take the Airshow as an example) you may encounter issues with the app uploading scores on the day or at specific times, but if this occurs it can be an exception and not the rule.

Moving forward, please take into consideration that the new app is still a learning curve for all of us using this new complex system. If you still have any issues or need any assistance with respect to the scoring app on your phone, please make arrangements to see us in the pro shop preferably during a quiet period.

By the time this newsletter reaches you, some members would have already started their 2023 Club Championships. We wish everyone well including all the junior members participating in their Junior Championships on the weekend of October 21st and 22nd. For any youngster wanting to book a reserved tee time for the Junior Championships please contact the pro shop.

This year the golf committee and board have endorsed the introduction of a D Grade division for both Men and Women in the championships along with a veteran's competition ran concurrently for all the women competing in 2023 alongside the men's veteran's competition.

The winning team in this year's Scramble Ambrose event were all home grown. Scott Eddy, Grant Stewart, Jeremy Cardillo and Brett Molnar had a super score of 55.5 nett to win by just .5 of a shot.



They now go onto the regional final to try their luck and then hopefully progress to the national final in QLD in early 2024.

Congratulations to Hugo Jankov for winning the singles knockout 3/2 over Jeff Rogers.

Jenny Baurle from Kyabram winning the nett A grade with 145. And Glynda Hoskin winning the gross competition on 176.


